I knew casualty, he was a medium built man, 5'8" in height, dark complexion, about 30 years of age. Casualty was at Bellinglise taking part in a small stunt and as he was going forward was killed by machine gun fire, death being instantaneous. I was within a few yards of him when he was killed, but could not stop to examine his body. He was buried next day near where he fell.

I knew Casualty, he was fair, well built, 5'10" in height, 23 years of age, known as "Mac". Casualty was in the attack on the Hindenburg Line at Bellanglise when he was hit through the body by a Machine Gun bullet, killing him instantly. I was about 10 yards away at the time, and saw him fall. The Stretcher Bearers of the Battalion, buried him, and took his pay-book etc. off him. I do not remember their names.
