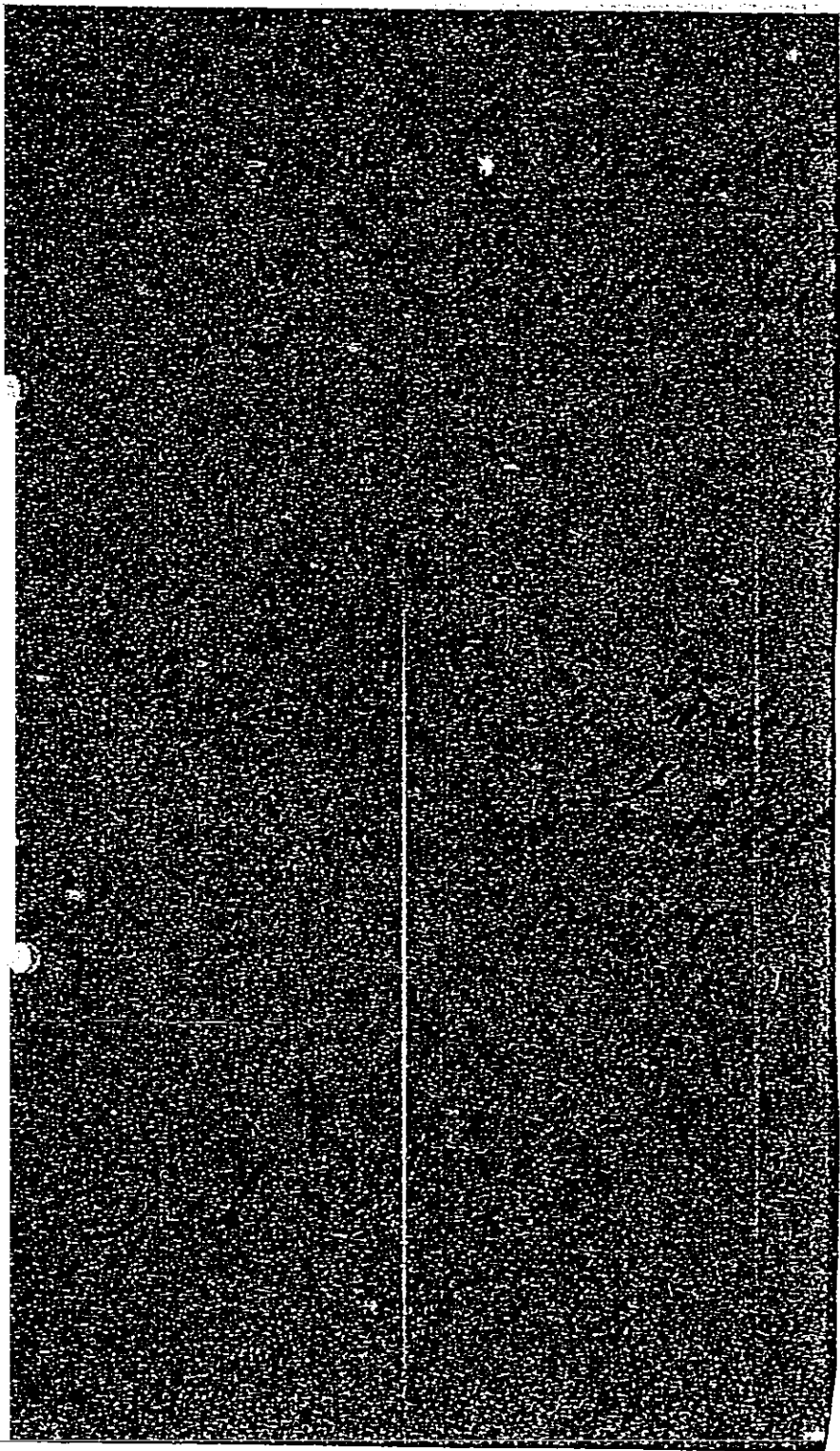

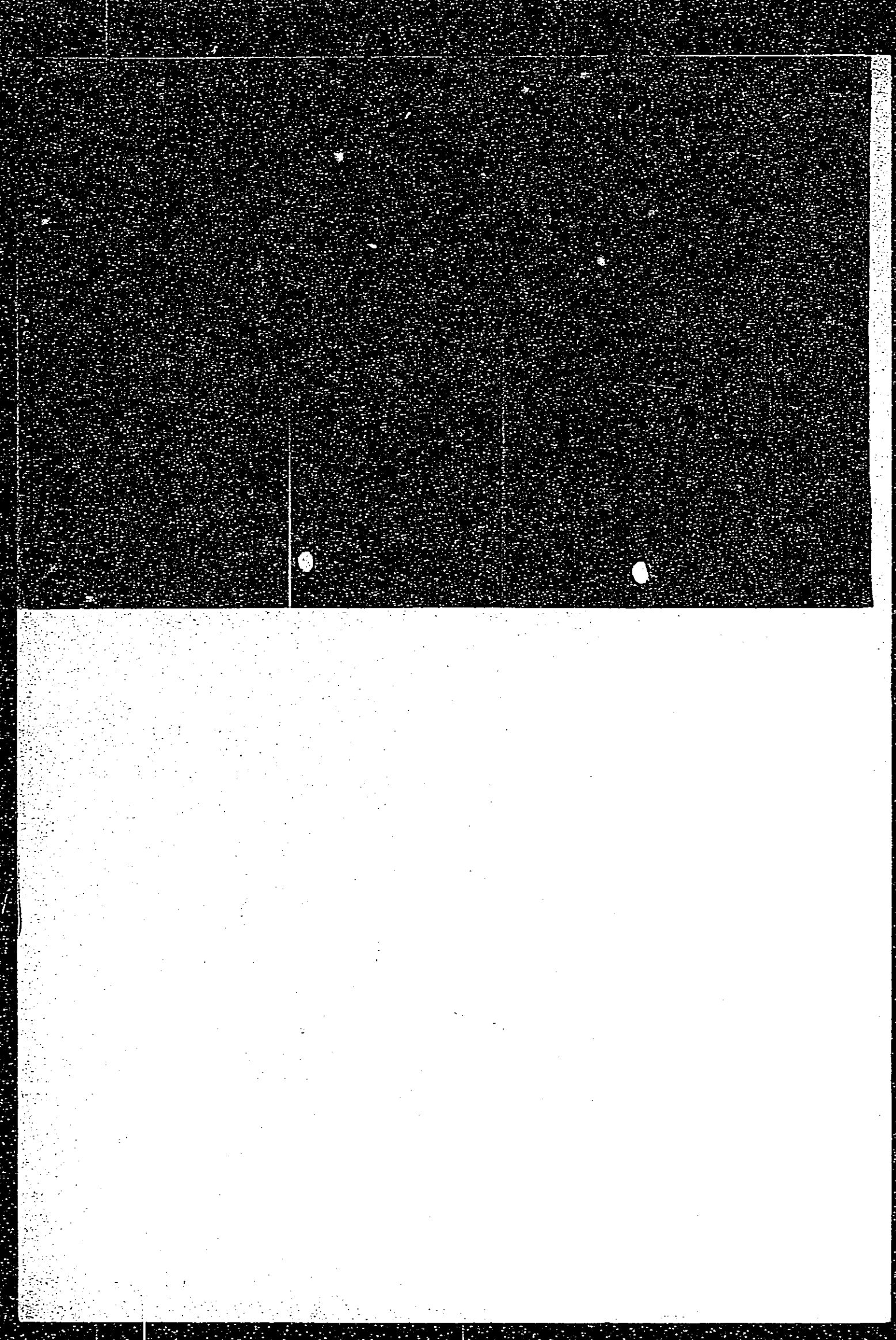

Headquarters Horseferry Road, for information concerning this soldier, but met with no report other than "Missing" 11.4.17.
