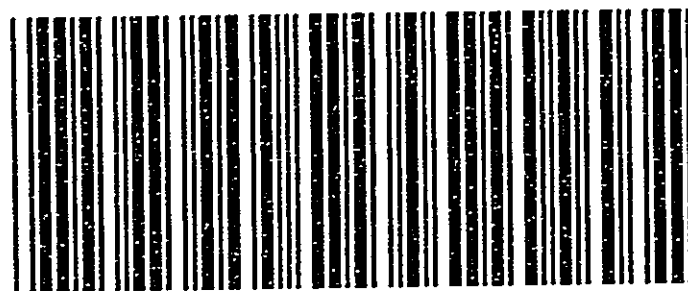

"Killed 10-8-18"

He was in A. Coy., and was a Cpl. I saw him killed on the Ridge at Lihons, when he lived but a few minutes, he being hit in stomach and legs by bullets. We were advancing at the time, about 8-30 a.m. on 10-8-18. I knew him well, and he came from Vistoria, he was a very nice chap. I never spoke to him after he was hit and cannot give any details of burial, but we held the ground. I cannot refer to anyone for further details.

"Killed 10-8-18"

He was in A.Coy., and was a Cpl. I did not see the casualty, but saw him dead a few hours later in the day. He had been hit by a M.G. bullet in the leg, and went down a big hole where we found him dead and sitting up. We could not make out what caused his death. Casualty happened at Rosieres in the morning about 9 a.m. on 10-8-18. I wrote to his people at Katunga, Nimine Road, Middle Park, Melbourne, Victoria, and told them all I knew. I do not know anything of burial, for we left body there when we came out of the line. I heard they were all buried by the 8th Battn. Padre.

"Killed in Action 10-8-18"

Was in A. Company. 4th Platoon. 6th Battalion. a corporal.
Tall, fair, well built, good athlete. He was hit about 8.30 a.m.
on 10th August during the advance on Lihons Ridge by a machine gun
bullet in the inside of left leg. A machine gunner bandaged him
up, and then went on with the advance till he got to the front
line. Then he went back with two stretcher bearers to pick him up
but they found Goold had bled to death. The machine gunner was
Pte. J.A. Brown. 1506. He told me all about it, but was killed by a
sniper the same evening. Goold's brother got full particulars before
he went back to Australia.

"Killed in Action 10-8-18"

Sgt Jenkins's statements is correct. I came up and found Gould sitting propped up in a crevice with a big stream of blood coming from his leg. He had just died from loss of blood. I took his pay book and handed it in.

"I knew Casualty. He was about 5-ft. 10 ins. well built, fair complexion. 22 years of age, known as "Jack". Casualty was advancing at Rosieres when he was hit by a machine gun bullet which killed him instantly. He was buried about 100 yds. from Rosieres Railway Station."
