He was going along the duck boards when a shell dropped practically at his fact killing him instantly. Later his body was recovered and buried mear the spot, Westhock Ridge Sept. 20th 1917. I saw his grave. He was well-known to me before the war." Eye witness: No.

We were attacking at Tpres on the right of the Medin Road in the morning of the 20th Septr. I was about 100 yards from Ferguson when a shell burst and killed him and elso a man named Hanairann and wounded L/Opl Olive of C.Co. X1 Pltn, not with the Battn row. We advanced and that is all I know.

He was of C.Company. On right of Ypres about noon of 20th Sept 1st day of our offensive. I was 50 yards away from Perguson when he was hit by shell, Killed cutright along with 2 or 3 others. I did not go over to the spot. Know nothing of burial, as I was hit later on in the day. Knew him well. Came from Sydney, age about 19 years, moight 52t 10 ins, fair, strong build.
