DIED OF WOUNDS. 30/9/16.

I knew an R. Cameron in the 55th - he was a red-headed fellow, and was in the same raid as I was at the end of September, 1916, at Fleurbaix. He was very severely wounded, but was taken back to the billets. I do not know how long he lived exactly, but about two days after the raid I saw him buried in the Cemetery at Fleurbaix, and a small cross with his name on it was placed on the grave.

We trained together for that raid. He was a real good mate.
