

Of C. Company. On the 2nd September at Peronne, during our attack, was killed outright by machine gun bullet, hit through forehead. I did not see it happen. 3 or 4 men out of our Company told me particulars. Know nothing of burial. Came from Country District, New South Wales.

55th Bttn. C.Coy. 5/8 in height, fair, aged 24 yrs. I do not know from what state he came. At Peronne on Sept. 2/18 at 8 a.m. in the attack Ellis was killed instantly by machine gun fire. He was buried in Herbecourt.Mil.Cemetery behind Peronne. The Bttn. Cross was erected.

Informant described Ellis as about 5 feet 7/8 inches high, stout build, reddish complexion, aged about 19/20.

Informant states that they both belonged to C. Company No. 10 platoon. On 2/9/18 the Battalion was in Action at Peronne. They layed over at 7 a.m. About an hour afterwards while they were still advancing, Ellis was badly wounded, probably by machine gun fire and died less than an hour afterwards being unconscious the whole time. Informant saw him lying dead on the ground at about the expiration of that time when he was coming out wounded. He was subsequently told that Ellis was brought in that night and buried, but could not say where.

According to Informant Ellis was a well liked chap.

Informant described Ellis as about 5ft. 8" high, fairly heavy build, fair complexion, aged 20/25, was a farmer in civil life. Informant states that they both belonged to "C" Coy.

On 2-9-18 the Battalion was in action at Fricourt. They stopped over at 6 a.m., and about  $\frac{1}{2}$  an hour afterwards, before the objective was reached, Ellis was killed outright by machine gun fire. Although Informant was only 20 or 30 yards away he did not see Ellis hit. Informant was wounded about  $\frac{1}{2}$  of an hour later, and on his way back saw Ellis lying dead on the ground where he fell. He was told that Ellis was buried near to where he was killed.

According to Informant Ellis was a good lad and well thought of by his mates.

With reference to your letter of 20th March 1919 enquiring for 3777 Pte. V.H. Ellis, 55th Battalion. A.I.F. We beg to inform you that we have an unofficial report concerning him from 3602 Pte. J.S. Franklin of the same Unit who states that Pte. Ellis was killed instantly by a machine gun bullet through the forehead during the attack at Beronne on 2nd Sept. 1918. This report is confirmed by 3599 Sgt. J.W. Dent, but neither informants could give us any information about Pte. Ellis' burial.

We have placed his name on our enquiry list, and will immediately advise you of any further details which may reach us.

With reference to your enquiry for 3777 Pte.

WERNER MURRAY ELLIS. 55th Battalion. A.I.F. We beg to inform you that he is officially reported to have been buried at Harbecourt Com. Cem. Extension  $4\frac{1}{4}$  miles west of Peronne, the map reference being D.G.R.E.L.S.5. 2950. We have also received an unofficial report concerning his death from 1171 Pte. A.E. MACKENZIE of the same Unit who has now returned to Australia., and who states that Pte. Ellis was severely wounded at Peronne on 2.9.18 by machine gun fire, in the early morning. He never regained consciousness and died on the field about an hour after the advance. The informant says that Pte. Ellis was very well liked in the regiment.

We fear there is little chance of our obtaining further details, so we are now closing our enquiries.
