Pte. C. E. Hart was admitted on the 8th June with a shrapnel wound in the abdomen (penetrating) His wounds were fatal. everything possible was done for him, but in spite of the combined efforts of a competent staff of medical officers and nurses, he passed away on the 9th of June. His remains were laid to rest in the British Cemetery in this town the same day, and it was my sad duty to conduct the burial service. You can assure the relatives of the deceased man that everything possible was done for their dear one, and that he had respectable Christian burial. The grave is carefully marked with a cross, with full particulars on them, and the cemetery is beautifully kept by the Military Authorities. Will you please convey my deepest sympathy to the relatives in their grief and sorrow.
