

Was a private in D.Company. 13th Platcon. 5th Battalion. big lump of a fellow. 5ft 10 or 5ft 11, well built, dark, sallow complexion.

He was one of 4 stretcher bearers who were carrying cut a wounded Frits on the morning of the 24th August about 9 o'clock. A shell landed near by and three of the stretcher bearers were hit. Horwood was badly wounded in back and leg, and died almost at once, without being conscious. It was an St Martin's Wood, we had taken it the previous day and there were a lot of wounded Germans lying about, and we were carrying them in. I saw him just before he was hit, was told immediately it happened, and hurried along, but he was dead when I got there. Did not see him buried, but it was near by.

Sgt Dew's account is correct, except that I am sure Horwood had fair hair. I was standing at the Dressing Station and saw the shell lob and knock 3 of the stretcher bearers who were carrying in the wounded Huns. We ran down to them and found Horwood was dead, left him there and carried in the wounded was. When I passed there again, his body had been removed, But I don't know where he was buried.

About 5ft 10ins high, fair complexion, about 26 years of age. Horwood was in the same Platoon with me and we were in the line at St. Martins, Wood near Proyat. There were some wounded Germans in our trenches and Horwood with two other volunteered to carry them back. While doing this a shell landed, killed Horwood and wounded another. Horwood died instantly. He was buried in St. Martins Wood.

We had hopped over and taken St. Martins Wood near Proyart in the morning of 23/8/18. In the afternoon Horwood was assisting in the removal of Wounded Germans, when a Fritz shell burst alongside our party killing him and wounding two others. I did not see the casualty occur but saw Horwood's dead body about four minutes after death. He was lying on his back and as there were no wounds exposed I take it he was wounded in the back. He was buried somewhere in the vicinity where he was killed Horwood was in my platoon about 5'9" in height, well built and of dark complexion.
