Informant states that on a Sunday monring in Nov. outside Facurs 1; miles from "Swiss (reserve trench)" After going
over the top, we went forward for about 100 yds. then, as our
own objective failed, we had to get into shell holes, till it
was dark enough to retire. My shell hole being deeper than
Crowley's I beckened to him to come over but a machine gun bullet
struck his through the head, just as he put it up and he was killed
instantly. It was his first time in the trenches after being
in Hespital."

I knew Crowley well and he came from Australia together. We first went to Egypt abilithen came on to France. On the morning of Nov.14th 1916, he and I went over with our En. to hold a trench on the right of Flers. While doing so, a shell exploded and ikeyx a part hit him in the arm. I helped to give him first aid. He then made his way to a Dressing Station, and while on the road he came under German M.G.Fire, and tried to get sover by dodging from one shell hole to another, and on raising his head at the last place, he was hit right in the forehead and killed imstantly. I am unable to say anything about his burial, but Gpl. Gardner of Crowleyss Co spent some time in looking for a brother who was killed at the same place and might be able to give some information respecting that matter.

I was the Sgt. in charge of a party of men the cent up to Plers on 10th. March to see if we could find trace of any of our men who had been missing since the Row. 14th. atunt. I remember the name of D. Crowley well and we buried him in the Gully to the right of the Butte of Warlehcourt, not in the cemetery though we formed a kind of one. This was in front of a trench called Mars trench and a cross was erected on which we put his name and number.
