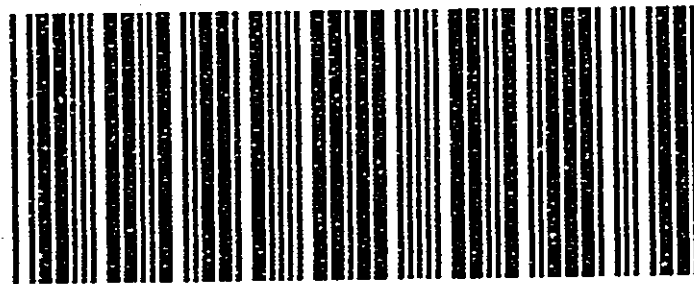

SEARCH was made in the area of the camp and the following
was found: a small metal box, a tin of matches and some debris
found on the left. The debris was found in the "alley
of the camp" and could not be traced to the location.
There is a good chance, however, that Barrack may be a
prisoner, as the names of others of the party are like
his and he is reported as missing. It has been suggested that
they are prisoners.
The names of the names of prisoners
are on the fact that they have been sent to places in Asia
East.
