

We took our objective and held it. He was about 27 years of age. nuggety, cleanels were.

We have been making enquiries for you as by arrangement with A.I.F.H.QRS we search for all officially Hissing Men, and your name was given to us by HQRS on 5.7.17, Our enquiries however have met with a reply from Sgt. L.Allwright to the effect that you are well and with your unit and had merely been away with Lt. Gatenby for 2 months at a school. We should be very grateful if you will kindly write and confirm this; as we shall then be able to remove your name from the List of Missing Men and inform anyone who may enquire about you that you are well and with your unit.
