#### "Died of Wounds 12-4-18"

Re 3752 Cpl.H.N.Bickicrd. 71st Bettn.A.I.F. We are in receipt of your letter enquiring for the above mentioned soldier, who was admitted to this Ecspital on the 10-4-18 with Gun Shot Wound. Left Shoulder and Thighs. His case on admission did not permit much hopes of recovery and I regret to inform you of his death which took place on the 12-4-18. You may assure his parents that everything possible was done to try and save his life and that he had all the care and attention that medical science and good nursing could give him.

He was buried in the Military Cemetery close by with full Military honcurs. His grave is properly marked and kept and a woodene cross, bearing his name and regiment, erected. Owing to regulations I am not permitted to give you the name of the place but if you write to the Director of Graves Registration. Winchester Hous St James's Square, London, he will I feel sure be only toopleased to give you the news you require.

I trust that these few details will be of some comfort to his parents and will you please assure them of the sincere sympathy of myself and staff in their sad bereavement.
