He is buried at Jeancourt Military Cenetary - the map reference of his grave being 62.C.L.26.D.85.

Concerning your enquiry for Leo Butler Tasmanian Infentry, we beg to inform you that we have no record of this soldier in the A.I.F. We have on our lists 2/Lt. F. Lionel Austin Butler, 12th Bttn. A.I.F. who came from Hobert and who died of wounds on 23.8.16, and for whom there is no official record of burial.
