

In answer to Miss Deakins enquiry Mechanic W.H.Lord died in Hospital at Adama, though as we are not able to speak with or communicate with the men, I do not know the cause of death. We in this Camp are all well. According to their circular your British Society have been misinformed Anthony Hordern 2 Fortnum's have not got branches here. We Australians all received the 4 or 5th of those sums (65 piastres) that you mentioned sending in your letter of July last year for which many thanks.

Was very pleased to receive your letter of 15th March. We were all sorry to hear of the death of Capt. T. in France. He deserved better luck and we hope that his two comrades are quite well. The remainder: from that place were moved soon afterwards and put in more difficult places.

Many thanks for being so good as to store my uniform when it arrives I am glad that those recent arrivals in England were able to give you so so much news. They know more of the real state of affairs than the three gentlemen who went before them. Could you inform the Office that of the Flying Corps men in Turkey Sergt. Maj. Campbell, Sorgt. F. Read, Corps Sloss, and Air Mechanics Hudson, Maines, Micholls, Mixon, Wells and Snell are well, for they do not seem to know. The others will not need comfere of any kind now. They were fifty-one originally. I often receive letter from their relatives asking whereabouts of different ones, or if still alive.

Host of us have received cheque-books from the Australian Pay Office in London, We were pleased to receive them and thankful for the arrangements made, for till their arrival, we had had to write manuscript cheques on our private banks. With Rindest regards, "
