I have received your letter dated 5th instant regarding the original cross on the grave of Captain G.E. Wells 11th F.A.B. Australian Imperial Forces which his father wishes to have forwarded to him when the permanent headstone is erected on thergrave. Wells, 41st Battery, 11th Australian Field Artillery Brigade, was according to official report buried at Reninghelst New Military Cemetery.
