I knew Parker; he was a cousin of mine. His initial was J. and he was a 2nd Lt. to the 18th. Bn. I am in the 19th. and was told on Monday, 23.8.15. that he had been killed on the Sunday, the 22nd. Aug. 1915. in the second charge on Hill 60. I went over on the Monday afternoon and saw his body. He was smashed all over the stomach by a shell but I was able to recognise him. He must have been killed practically outright. I have written and told his mother but she will not believe he is dead. I cannot say if he was buried but I am quite sure it was he and that he was dead. His name was Joe and he comes from Roselle, N.S.W. but was originally an Englishman and in the Navy. H.S.O.
