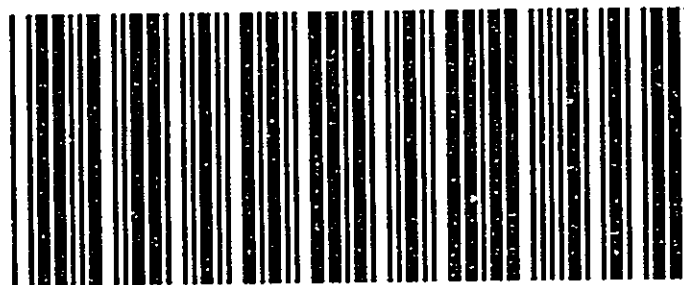

Witness saw Perrott just before we made a charge on the 22nd August. It was a Sunday morning. The casualties were very heavy. After reaching the Turks' trenches we had to retire. I never saw him afterwards and it was generally believed among the men of the Coy that he was killed in that charge.
