This man died on the above date at the 16th General Hospital, now No. 10 (Philadelphia) General Hospital, and is buried at Mont Euon Cemetery. We have written again to this O.C. asking him to let us know to whom to apply as the Hospital records of that date have apparently been forwarded to England, and we shall advise you of the result of our enquiries. Scott, died in this Hospital on the 12th October 1917, suffering from wounds of the leg and amputation of the same. He was buried in Mont Euen British Military Cemetery near Le Treport, France in Grave No. 626-A on 13th October 1917 by the Rev. Beckwith..

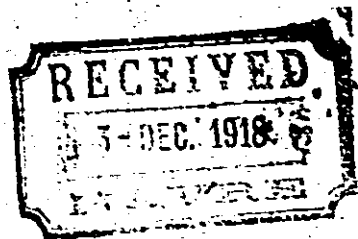

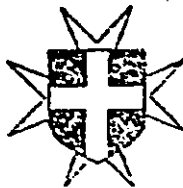

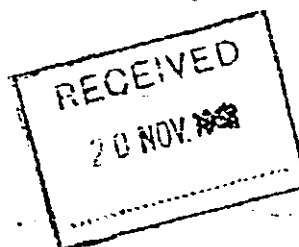
