He was in C. Coy. I did not see him killed. Pte. L. J. McSweeney, C. Coy. told me that he was on the same night patrol on Passchendaele and saw him killed about 2.0 a.m. by a shell. I am pretty certain Mr. Irving was buried on the ridge, it being too far to take him back to a Cemetery; there was no counter attack. I believe Pte. McSweeney is with the Bn. Mr. Irving came with me from Australia as a L/Corpl. on Oct 25/1914, in the Argonne. His No. as a L/Cpl. was 1001; his name was Willie; he came from Kanowna, W.A.

"Died of Wounds 28-3-18"

Re Pte. Hemming. He was one of a party of stretcher bearers in our Coy., there being 6 in all. He worked with me bringing in the wounded on the Albert-Amiens road. A shell exploded amongst us at about 4 p.m. on the 27th March. Pte. Hemming was severely wounded in the stomach and was taken down to the dressing station by two Australians from same Coy., one's name was Pte. Marshall. I did not know the other one. I was also wounded but managed to walk down the line. I have made enquiries about him but they have proved unsatisfactory. He was of fair complexion, height about 5'8", and his temperament suggests that of a very quiet fellow.
