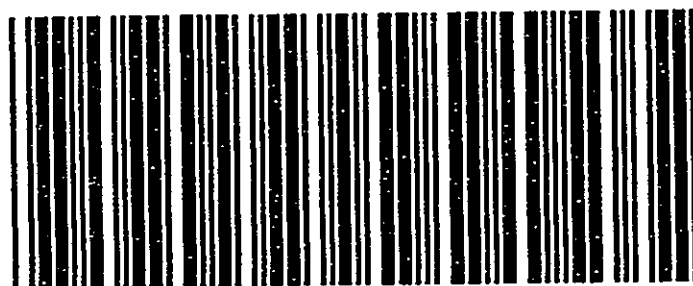

I know Skinner well, he and I were in Eo 11 platoon 3rd section of A Coy, 10th Batt. on Gallipoli. He was missing after the 1st day 25th April and I saw his body at the time of the armistice on 20th May 1915 when we were burying the dead. I could recognise him quite easily. I only know one Skinner in A Coy and do not think there was another in the Battn. He was about 6 ft high, fair and well built. I saw his body up near the Lone Pine trenches.

Witness states that he knew a man named Skinner in the 10th Bt. He came from Adelaide and was in the old F Co and later in A Co. Witness knows that he landed on the Peninsula on 25/4/15 and took part in the fighting. Witness saw him there on that day but has not seen him since.

Informant states - "These men were landed from the same boat with me, but I never saw them after I left the boat. Many men were shot when jumping out of boat into the water and, as the water was almost up to ampits, I daresay they were drowned, and the bodies never recovered. I do not believe they ever got across the beach to cover."
