Concerning 424 Coy Sgt. Major V.W. Orr who was killed in Action 5.5.17. he was not buried by this unit, as it was impossible to do so at the time whether he was buried by Unit which relieved us I cannot say. I have written to his brother Sgt. G. Orr Finance Sect. A.I.F. Head Qtrs some time ago giving him all particulars in my power he was about 24 years old, height 5'10" stately built, brown eyes dark hair freckled complexion

I knew C.S.M. William Orr. I saw him killed instantly - blown to pieces at Bullecourt on May 3rd, 1917 in the 2nd German lines. He took our objective and held the ground, but very few of the bodies were buried owing to heavy fire.

I think that V.W. Orr may be Sergt. Major Orr, Acting Sarrant Officer. Sergt. Major Orr was an original man. When he was killed he was on H.A. Before that he was Sergt. Major of B Co. (He was in charge of an ammunition column going up with the Pioneers). Three pioneers were carrying ammunition up to a machine gun. They crouched down alongside the trench owing to shells bursting. Orr was killed there (in the front line) by concussion. I think it was concussion as there were no marks or blood on him. He may have been buried there. Inquiries should be made at the 23rd Battalion H.A. I was told this by the Pioneers after we had come out.

Orr had been promoted to R.S.Maj. I do not know his initials; he had been a Sergt. in I think G. Company, and his number was a low one. I was with him when he was killed by shell near the German 1st Line at Bullecourt on the afternoon of May 3rd, 1917, and I saw the pioneers taking the body to a small Military Cemetery on the Railway Embankment at Bullecourt.
