He was fatally wounded in the stomach at about daybreak on May 3/17. at Bullecourt. He was walking about in the trench wounded when I saw him, was taken out at about midday and died, I believe about 2 days later ..

He came over with me in the 11th Reinforcements, belonged to A. Coy. 11 Platoon. no was. 452217/ about 5ft 8. ~~A.I.F.~~ *slight*

I did not see the casualty, and I cannot refer to anyone for details, but I was down at the Hospital at Grenelles, one day, playing in the band, and I went across to the cemetery near by, to have a look round, and I saw his grave there, which was marked with a cross, bearing his number name and unit. I knew him very well, he came away from Australia with me on the 21.3.16 by the "S.S. Mulwa"
