#### "Died of Wounds 21.8.17

About Fte. N.E. Saunders. I knew his mother had heard from us, though she may not have had all the letters, but a friend of mine in Albany mentioned to me that Mrs. Saunders had had several letters from this unit. Saunders was attached to this Unit. He was killed instantly by a shell that hit the railway that ran through our camp when we were at Bardbeke. He was one of the dozen, offfcers and men, who were left in a guard the evening of the day we
had all the vacuate owing to the persistent shelling. Two boys were
hit about 10.30.p.m. Saunders died at once. He was buried next
day in the cemetery adjoining the camp and in the presence of
those who had been with him on course. those who had been with him on guard, and of a few other officers and men who went up with me for the funeral.
