

He was buried at in the cemetery at Bullecourt where most of our fellows are buried. He was a very fine lad and well respected by everyone.

built, medium complexion, about 25 years of age. Casualty was in support line trench on the sucken road just near Norenil Village. He was in a small dug-out on the side of the road. The bank of the road fell in and buried Casualty and 5 other men. I helped to dig Casualty out but he was dead when we recovered him. The chief cause of his death was by suffocation. He was buried just near the spot where he died. I was an eye-witness."
