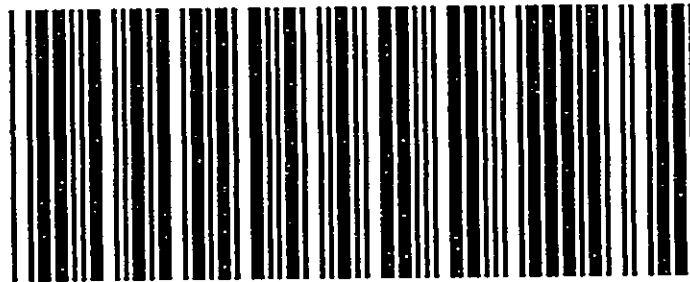

In reply to your inquiries for details about your son

No 2529 Pte. F.J.Williams,

who Died of Wounds received in action on 11.4.17, we very much regret that we have been unable to obtain any particulars from C.O. of the C.C.S., He may however, have sent them direct to Australia, and we hope that is the case. He was buried in the Avelien Communal Cemetery Extension, 1½ miles N. of Albert by the Church of England Chaplain and we have already applied to the Graves Registration Department for a photograph of his grave which will be sent to you in due course.
