Miller died in No. 3 Auxiliary Hospital on above date of pneumonia after having been in the hospital a month, during which time he ran a very high temperature and was delirious most of the time, and was always talking about when he was going to get back to the front. He was a great favourite with every one. The C.O. (Col. Grey) and another of the medical officer who, tho' not being especially in charge of the case, used to visit him constantly, as did Sister O'Connor, who was a personal friend and whom he had known at home. In spite of every care and attention he went from bad to worse, and for the last fortnight he had a day and night special nurse. The night special nurse, Agnes Sheppard, has now returned to Australia, and the day one, sister Davidson, has gone to France. Sister Beatrice Walker was also in his ward and is in Egypt somewhere, but the Matron who has given the above information does not think she would ~~for~~ know any further particulars, as she was not in special charge. The Matron says every possible thing was done for his comfort in every way, she herself used to see him every day. He was not conscious when he died.
