

We were all withdrawn save a batch including the abovenamed casualties. Informant was sent back to the beach for ammunition. Informant is strongly of the opinion that the above were taken prisoners.

VEITCH, A.W. 157 VEITCH, D. 158

Informant states that the above named casualties were father and son, A.W. Veitch the father. Thus casualty was 5'8 in height, dark, medium build, heavy moustache. The above named casualty, D. Veitch, the son, was 5'10, fair, clean shaven, called "Don". Father was called "Arthur". They stuck together on the Peninsula and landed from the same boat from the transport Clan McGillivray on the 25th April and went up together with informant into the firing line. Informant spoke to them and then he got wounded on the same day. On returning to the Peninsula in June informant made enquiries about them and learnt from men whose names are unknown to him that both casualties were killed on the 25th.
