I was with him stretcher bearing when he was hit by a shell dying instantly. Going into the Polygon Wood stunt on the night of the 25th Sept. or morning of 26th Sept. Probably buried at the 2nd D. Stn. not far from the old support line near Menin Road. Piece of shell right through the heart.

Wainwright and Pte. T.E. Chambers were members of the same Lewis gun team. They were both very badly wounded by the same shell, but they were not killed outright. I/Cpl. P.I. Connelley, 15th Battn. No. 1 in the same gun team, saw it, and he it was that told me, and he will be able to tell you whether the men died of their wounds afterwards. This occurred at Polygon Wood. ~~South of Polygon Wood~~

Re Etc. H. Wainwright No. 6628 who was killed on the 27/9/17. To the best of my belief and from Enquiries made he was killed going into Action and was buried about the same place. Just on the East side of Westhoeke Ridge. Description - Height about 5' 10" about 12 stone weight Age about 22 years medium Complexion.

"I knew Casualty. He was a man about 5 ft. 10 ins. slightly built, fair complexion, about 22 years of age. Casualty was in the front line trench at Ypres on the 26th September, 1917. An H.E. shell exploded in the trench killing Casualty instantly. I was 2 yds. from him at the time of his death and I was wounded by the same shell. I was taken away immediately and that was the last I saw of Casualty."

With reference to your enquiry concerning :-

6628 Pte. H. WAINWRIGHT, 15th Battalion, A.I.F.

We have received the following unofficial reports from two men of the same Battalion.

7020 Pte. A. W. HOSS, 15th Battn, C. Coy, Hat 12, No 2 Command Depot, Westham, Weymouth, states that he was told by his comrades that Pte. Wainwright was killed by the same shell, which wounded himself, at Polygon Wood in September. Informant adds that Pte. Wainwright was close to him before the casualty occurred.

6758 Pte. A. DUCK, 15th Battalion, A.I.F., states that he was stretcher bearer with Pte. Wainwright at Polygon Wood, when he was hit by a piece of shell, which pierced the heart, and he died instantly. Informant thinks that he would probably be buried near No 2 Dressing Station, not far from the old support line, near Menin Road.

We are continuing our enquiries and hope to send you further details of his burial at a later date.
