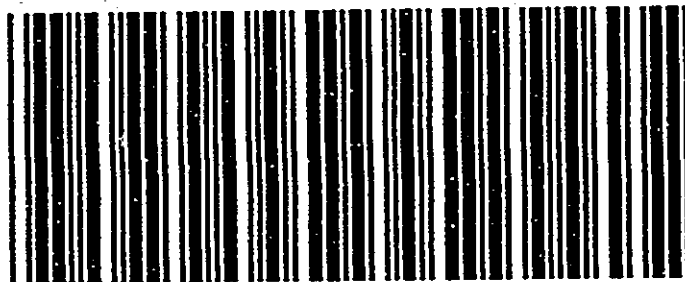

I have seen his grave in the Military Cemetery, just near High Wood, about 4 miles from Ypres. There is a cross on the grave with his name on it. He was killed while in his dugout at Ypres, with a section of Lewis Gunners, who had come out for a spell.

Informant states that on Oct. 1st Nr. Kemmel Hr Ypres Verrall was killed by a shell which killed 2 others and wounded 3. He was buried at Ridgewood. Informant saw the grave which was marked by a cross with name and number. Informant was an eye-witness. The ground at the time was held.
