A.I.F.	4061	Sergeant Stanley Robert MCDOUGALL.	<p>For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at DERHAMCOURT on 6th April 1918 during heavy enemy attack, he took a Lewis Gun to a very exposed position where he could enfilade enemy at close quarters up to 30 yards. He maintained his gun until it was pierced by a bullet, then crawled 300 yards, got another gun and returned to his post in "No Man's Land" where he was responsible for many dead. Later during our counter-attack he organized a platoon after the officer was killed and led them in the attack.
