During the attack on 11th August, 1919 against RAINDOWN, East of MILING, this man displayed exceptional courage in attempting to cut off a party of retreating enemy. After the objective had been reached he noticed four of the enemy vacate a post and retire down the gully. Without hesitation he followed them until he was himself held up by heavy machine gun fire. Still determined he took up a sniping position and succeeded in inflicting one casualty on the retreating party, the remainder hurrying off after unsuccessfully attempting to secure rescue their wounded comrades.

During the operations on morning of 11th August, 1919 against RAINDOWN, East of MILING, this signaller displayed conspicuous bravery in maintaining telephone lines passing through the village of MILINGVILLE.

The village was subjected to an extremely heavy bombardment throughout the day, lines from Battalion Headquarters being repeatedly broken.

Pte. JULLIAN worked incessantly with his Sergeant repairing the breaks and it was owing to the courage and disregard for personal safety of this signaller that communication was maintained.
