It was largely due to his leadership that one of the enemy pill-boxes was successfully dealt with. Throughout he showed himself to be a fine leader and inspired his men by his absolute fearlessness and determination. His platoon captured over a dozen prisoners and inflicted heavy losses on the enemy.

At HANDBEKE WOOD on 20/9/17 he was Coy. Scout and throughout the whole day showed great courage and initiative. He single-handed approximed an enemy dugout and caused 8 of them to surrender, and captured a H.G. He set a great example to those near him. He was also responsible for about 30 men of his company who were lost moving up, being in their correct position before zero hour.
