Mear VILLERS ERETONNEUX on the morning of 4th July, 1918, this man did excellent work as a sniper.

He was a member of a section who captured an enemy M.G. and 2 prisoners. His aniping was most effective scoring 4 known hits.

In face of heavy fire he took up a flank position and continued sniping whilst consolidation was being carried out. One of his compades leing wounded he carried him back under fire to a stretcher bearer party and returned to his position.

21st Bn. 5034 Pte. William Robert A.I.F. IRVING.

Hear VILLERS BRETOHIEUX on the morning of 4th July, 1918, this man carried out most effective work as a sniper.

He cleared an enemy trench in the face of heavy M.G. fire, killed two of the enemy and took one prisoner. He then crept forward and by effective eniping silenced a M.G. whilst his commudes outflanked and captured it.

He continued his aniping with very good effect and considerably assisted the consolidation of the newly captured ground.
