Near VILLERS BRETONNEUX on the morning of 4th July, 1918, this man did excellent work as a sniper.

He was a member of a section who captured an enemy M.G. and 2 prisoners. His sniping was most effective scoring 4 known hits.

In face of heavy fire he took up a flank position and continued sniping whilst consolidation was being carried out.

One of his comrades being wounded he carried him back under fire to a stretcher bearer party and returned to his position.

Near VILLERS BRETONNEUX on the morning of 4th July, 1918, this man carried out most effective work as a sniper.

He cleared an enemy trench in the face of heavy M.G. fire, killed two of the enemy and took one prisoner. He then crept forward and by effective sniping silenced a M.G. whilst his comrades outflanked and captured it.

He continued his sniping with very good effect and considerably assisted the consolidation of the newly captured ground.
