Edgar Frederick LAMONT M.M.	<p>On the morning of the 12th April in the Front Line near ALBERT.</p> <p>Two snipers whilst proceeding to take up their positions for the day were themselves sniped. Sgt. LAMONT at once got out of the trench and ran about 50 yds. to where they were lying. He bandaged them, directed one man slightly wounded to crawl in and carried the second himself to safety.</p> <p>All this was done under heavy sniping fire for which he showed utter disregard. I consider his conduct most gallant as others were unable to leave the trenches owing to the sniping.</p> <p>This M.C.O. was awarded the M.M. for work on March 22nd 1918 at WARNETON.</p> <p>Certified that this M.C.O. has not been recommended for King's Birthday List 1918.</p>	<p>Brig.
