S1103	50 INF. BRIGADE 8th Light Trench Mortar Battery, R.I.F.		Captain Roy Dawson MULVEY. M 4.1.17	This officer was appointed to command the Battery on 19th August 1916. He took part in successful raids on the German trenches at Fleurbaix on 16th September 1916 and Armentieres on October 12th, 1916. On both occasions he showed conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty under heavy fire. In the latter raid, one of his gun teams was destroyed by a large minenwerfer, but Captain Mulvey stuck to the remaining guns and carried out his part of the programme with the greatest coolness. On the Somme front, from January 18th to 29th, opposite LE TRANSLOY, Captain Mulvey was constantly in action and often under heavy fire, taking part in operations and directing the fire of his guns on the enemy trenches, with remarkable effect. On February 25th, he was wounded by a sniper in the front line, while selecting positions for his guns.	E. TIVEY, Brig-Gen. comdng 8th Inf. Bde.	MILITARY CROSS.
