Devotion to duty and good work during the period April 25th. to May 1st. 1915 at ANZAC in continuously rescuing wounded from very exposed positions single handed and carrying them to the beach under exceptionally heavy rifle and shell fire and carrying water to the trenches on his return journey.	O.C. 2nd. Fld. Ambulance	Military Medal	
	3rd. Field Ambulance	20	Private T. DEASY.	For consistent good work at ANZAC from April 25th to December 1915. He acted as stretcher bearer the whole time and was never absent from duty. His coolness and readiness for work during Lone Pine attack was specially noticeable.	O.C. 3rd. Fld Ambulance	Military Medal
