PILITERY CHORS HOTIFIED ON 87-11-16 AS HAVING HEER AVAILABLE

Captain, Arthur Poole LAWRENCE 6th Aust. Pld. Amb.

This officer displayed bravery and devotion to duty on Erd., 4th., and 5th October, 1918, during the fishting in the Mindenburg Line North of St. DURITIN, particularly during the assault on MONTHERMAIN, as bearer Captain 6th Aust. Field Ambulance. He maintained touch with Regimental Aid Posts in spite of heavy shell fire, his personal courage inspired many others; and his genius for relecting routes and loading posts resulted in a very rapid evacuation of wounded. His work throughout this period was quite outstanding: time after time he went to heavily shelled localities to extricate the wounded - he was always where the danger was greatest, where the casualties were occurring, and by his seed coolness and courage and example, rendered the most gallant service in a very difficult situation.

MILITARY BEDALS SOTIFIED ON 3-11-18 AS HAVING BEEN AWARDED.

No. 6381 Fte. Joseph RHODES 6th Aust. Field Ambulance.

On the Erd October, 1918, near ESTRES North of St. GUERTIN, this soldier proceeded to a wounded companion through 180 yards of heavy shell fire, dressed his wound and helped him to shelter. Later in the day he was alone at a Motor Loading Post, devoid of cover, and though wounded himself, he remained with a severely wounded man under heavy shell fire for over an hour, and tended him till he could be got away.
