Brigade was occupying a position on BAIKET EL SANA, the Dressing Station of the 1st. L.H.F. Ambulance was situated in rear of brigade and was subjected to heavy shell fire. Shells were bursting above and around the operating tent and the lives of wounded who were being rendered tended would certainly have been lost but for the promptitude of Staff Sergeant <u>WARDEN</u> who, at great personal risk, superintended and effected the transfer of tent and all wounded to a protected position.</p> <p>This N.C.O. has continuous service since the outbreak of war, serving through GALLIPOLI Campaign and SINIA Peninsula without a break.
