

Major Phillip Francis GELL, 14th Lancers, Indian Army, Special Service Officer, Jodhpur Imperial Service Lancers.

On 14th July, 1918, in front of HEMU Bridgehead, he commanded the turning movement of the Jodhpur Lancers which rolled up the enemy from the south and dispersed them. This Officer displayed quite exceptional ability as a Cavalry leader, and gave a magnificent example of bravery and dash to his men. He sabred three Turks himself and struck and dismounted several others with the hilt of his sword.

Lieutenant John Fettes FALCONER, MC., Indian Army Reserve of Officers, attached 29th Lancers, Indian Army.

On the 14th July, 1918, in front of HEMU Bridgehead. For conspicuous gallantry and ability when leading the machine gun sub-section which co-operated with the Jodhpur Lancers. Being given a free hand, this Officer, on finding that the best position for his guns was held by the enemy, charged and captured the position and brought his guns into action at fifty yards range on the retiring enemy, and on a nest of machine guns, which he silenced.
