Captain George ~~Horton~~ ANSON, 1/1st Staffordshire Yeomanry.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 17th April, 1917, near GAZA. He organized and led a party to find and bring back a wounded officer and some men who were lying some 700 yards from the Turkish trenches east of the WADI IMLEH. His utter disregard of danger set a magnificent example to the men with him, and enabled all the wounded to be brought in safely though under fire.
