He perconally assisted and supervised the guiding and forming up of men on the "jumping off" tape. This was under heavy Maching Cun fire and Lt. SHELDON worked untiringly and with atter disregard for his own Befety. Lt.SHEI,DON was on the jumping off tane when the attacking troops moved forward and shortly afterwards was seriously rounded. eventually succumbed to the rounds received. During the time I.t. SHEI, DON was with the H.S. Infantry he was untiring in his efforts to assist towards the subcess of the operations. Kis energies undoubtedly did much towards the successful forming up of the attacking troops.
