In connection with the assistance rendered to Deal Bn by D Coy 4th Bn (vide D.O's), Robson went ahead of reinforcing party, returned, showed the way, and as officer commanding reinforcing platoon was wounded, he acted as guide and subsequently controlled the all men in the vicinity. His position was one of open exposure but he personally carried ammunition to the Marines, whose supply was exhausted, and kept up a steady and very effective fire on the enemy, killing at least 20. All accounts agree that this soldier's conduct largely saved the situation and as only 5 men of the platoon were uninjured the nature of the peril was obvious. (Reported by Lt.Col.
