At VILLERS BRETONNEUX on 24th April when the Commanding Officer and a large portion of the Staff of the Battalion had become casualties, and the enemy had attacked and broken through our line, Major CAMERON took charge of the Battalion and after a personal reconnaissance of the position, formed a flank with his Battalion, thereby saving the situation. He had charge of the Battalion during the operations in July - at MORLANCOURT, and it was owing to the skilful handling of the Battalion and his ability that the minor operation carried out was so successful..
