WEISACK.

During the silent penetration of the enemy line on the afternoon of 9th July 1918, at MONTMIRIT WOOD, near VILLERS BRETONNEUX, Pte WEISACK was first bayonet man of the light assault party. After the entry, he led the way along the enemy trench for 300 yards, showing a conspicuous lack of fear, and killing three of the enemy. At points where the enemy was met, his determination was such as to cause panic among them. The flight of superior numbers of the enemy is attributed very considerably to his resolute attitude and close pursuit. His contempt for danger undoubtedly encouraged his comrades, and very largely attributed to the final and complete success of the operation. This man was afterwards wounded in a reconnaissance of a sap leading to the enemy's support lines.
