For very conspicuous bravery and daring as  
a patrol leader at VILLE-SUR-ANCRE on 11.5.18.

With two men he had pushed ahead of the  
rest of the patrol and had got close to the  
enemy posts when they came into collision with  
an enemy patrol. Lieut. WALL and his small  
party at once engaged the patrol and succeeded  
in breaking it up. They then moved forward  
and captured three prisoners - 2 wounded and  
one unwounded and in spite of heavy fire  
brought the prisoners back to the remainder of  
the patrol.

In this encounter this officer showed the  
utmost coolness and courage. On many occasions  
he has proved himself a brave and dashing  
leader and was subsequently wounded in the  
operation at VILLE-SUR-ANCRE on 19th May, 1918.
