At Ville-sur-Ancre, ^{near Albert} on 19th May 1918, this officer displayed great courage and devotion to duty during the operations which resulted in the capture of the village. The making and throwing of the four bridges over the River Ancre was a factor which largely contributed to the success of the attack; this was done under the direction and supervision of Major HARRIS, much of the work being carried out under heavy shell fire, during which he was an outstanding example of coolness and courage, setting a magnificent example, although he had then been working continuously without rest or sleep for over two days.	<i>John G.
