From 3rd to 6th Oct. 1917, E. of YPRES, this Officer was in charge of the Company, personally leading them in the advance with great courage and coolness. He personally rushed a shell hole, shooting one German and bayoneting another. Later his Company was being held up by four hostile machine guns, he displayed great skill in effectively dealing with them. On reaching his objective he supervised the siting and digging of the trenches, under heavy shell fire, regardless of personal safety.

The Company had sustained heavy casualties and he at once undertook the added responsibilities. He personally searched dug outs in the vicinity of the objective, sending back maps and information of great value. Throughout the operation, his courage and bravery were splendid and a fine example to all ranks.
