I have the honor to submit the name of the undermentioned officer for the notice of the Lieutenant General Commanding.

Licut. J.H. Kirams, No 2 Field Coy, Engineers.

On the 28th July 1915 an enemy mine tunnel suidenly disclosed itself in close proximity to one of our own, and it became a question which side was able to forestall the other. Thanks to the arrangements made by Lieut. Mirams, our mine was fired first. On reconnoitring the tunnel to ascertain whether neighbouring under ground works had been damaged, Lieut. Mirams was met by an explosion just as he reached the tamping of our mine and was badly burnt.

Lieut. Hirams has been carrying or similar mining operations on about 300 wards of frontage for the last month and by his viligance and careful timing, the enemy has been forestablen in three previous occasions. Owing to the distance underground each operation has been attended with considerable danger of being blown up by enemy mines.

I consider his services are deserving of recognition and I recommend him for the Hilitary Cross.
