During the preparations for the operations east of YPRES on 1st.October 1917, this N.C.C. had charge of a carrying party proceeding to WESTHOEK via CHATEAU Wood. On reaching the Wood the enemy put down a heavy barrage causing several casualties. Corporal LAMOND personally attended some of the wounded and got the remainder under good cover, but was badly wounded himself. He set a splendid example of personal bravery and devotion to duty.

During the operations east of YPRES on 4th. October 1917, he volunteered as a runner to carry an important message from strong point near MOLENAARELSTHOEK to WESTHOEK, through a particularly dangerous area, and delivered his message promptly. On his return journey he encountered a heavy barrage but persevered bravely until wounded. Knowing that his message was important he handed it over to another man and directed him to the strong point, thus showing a fine example of self sacrifice, as, night having fallen he rendered himself liable of remaining undiscovered in his wounded state until daybreak, knowing that such an exposure would probably cost him his life.
